A Message of Thanksgiving

Dear Beloved Congregation,

As autumn paints our world in vibrant hues and the season of Thanksgiving approaches, my heart is filled with gratitude for each one of you. November is a time when we are invited to pause, reflect, and remember the countless blessings that God has bestowed upon us—both great and small. Yet, as we count our blessings, we are also reminded by Scripture to be thankful not only in times of abundance, but in all circumstances.

The Apostle Paul encouraged the early church with these words: "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NIV). These are not just words for easy days—they are a call to gratitude even when life is difficult, when worries weigh us down, or when we face uncertainty. It is in these moments that our faith is refined and our trust in God deepens.

Jesus reminds us that gratitude is not dependent on our external circumstances, but on the steadfast love of our heavenly Father. By giving thanks in every situation, we are reminded of God's unfailing presence and are opened to see His blessings even in unexpected places. As Psalm 107:1 proclaims, "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever."

It is easy for those of us who live in abundance to be grateful for what we have. It is also easy for us to grow entitled and turn a blind eye to the needy. Oftentimes we feel we have earned what we have, forgetting that it is only by the grace of God that we are so blessed. I pray that as we reflect on our lives of abundance and worship God in gratitude and praise, that we remember to also feed the poor, clothe the naked, and visit those imprisoned. These are the things Jesus calls us to do with our lives of abundance. It is only when each person has enough to eat and drink, warm clothes to wear, and hope in Christ that the Kingdom of God will be realized. This is our responsibility but also our greatest joy—to give as Christ gave for each other.
