"Are you ready for Christmas?" How often do we hear that question asked of us in the month between Thanksgiving and Christmas? It is a great way to start a conversation this time of year. It sure beats comments on the weather. We do that the rest of the year and all we do is complain. But Christmas is different. We can speak joyfully about the plans we are making.

Sometimes, however, we are so caught up in our plans for the "mas"—the celebration or Mass —of Christmas, we forget to ready ourselves for the Christ of the holiday. We spend all our time shopping for presents for others because we feel an obligation to do so rather than out of generosity in our hearts. We fuss over our homes with extra cleaning and decorating. We put up the Christmas tree, spend hours wrapping presents, and risk our wellbeing on ladders hanging lights from our homes. Some of us go to parties to which we would not normally go because of a presumed social contract.

I am not saying all or any of these things are bad in and of themselves. There are many Christmas holiday traditions that bring joy to us, and we should definitely participate in those that draw us nearer to Christ and to others. The traditions that remind us of the true meaning of Christmas and those whose end results glorify Christ and the Father.

Advent is a period of waiting and of preparation. Instead of spending all of our Advent season looking outward and preparing our outward lives, we need to slow down and take time to look inwardly –preparing our hearts to receive the Christ child at Christmas. We do this during Advent because the Christ we are receiving is coming to us as a precious little baby and not the fierce warrior King of Christ the King Sunday –a representation of Christ at the end times when he returns as final judge and ruler of all.

Before we celebrate the Christmas holiday, we prepare our houses to receive guests by cleaning and decorating. We make the home feel cozier and more welcoming. We adjust our thermostats up a few degrees against the cold of outdoors. Some of us still make homemade candies, cookies, and cakes to have on hand for those guests who drop by. So should we be preparing our hearts to receive the Christ child. We need to sweep down the cobwebs of idleness in our hearts. We should be looking at producing
